The Clinical Research Professional – MSCTR Capstone is intended to demonstrate the ability of the student to synthesize and integrate his or her knowledge of the MSCTR-CRP core learning outcomes. The Capstone project may take many forms, such as a practice-based, evaluation of processes, or training development but must be the independent work of the student, not a product of the student's work environment.

Students are required to submit a Capstone Proposal to their MSCTR Advisor (Dr. Langevin or Ryan) outlining their proposed project. The Advisor will review the Capstone proposal for a variety of elements, including:

- Appropriateness for a CRP Capstone Project
- Applicability to the student's career objectives
- Potential of advancement of knowledge/benefit to internal and external stakeholders
- Incorporation of principles or skills obtained through the MSCTR–CRP coursework
- Feasibility

Once the Capstone proposal has been approved by the Advisor, the student should make continuous progress on the project as the semester progresses. The first draft of the Capstone project should be submitted to the Advisor no later than 4 weeks prior to the end of the semester, per the timeline listed in the Capstone syllabus. Students submitting a draft after the deadline will not be eligible for graduation that semester.
