Advacacy for Patrons of Our Daily Bread Soup Kitchen





Our Daily Bread (ODB)

- Our Daily Bread is the largest soup kitchen in Greater Cincinnati serving warm, free meals to 400+ guests a day, 5 days a week
- When other services closed during the pandemic, more than 450 guests visited ODB per day
- 100% of the food served is either donated or rescued
- Located just across from Findlay Market, in Over-the-Rhine (OTR), a predominantly Black neighborhood facing constant gentrification
- Age range of guests are 19-72 and 58.4% are Black/African American
- OTR lost 73% of affordable housing units in the period between 2002 to 2015



Service Learning Project

Investigating the needs of ODB patrons and assessing COVID-19 vaccinations in OTR

- → Surveyed 77 ODB patrons
- → Distributed over 240 hand warmers over the period of 3 survey days
- → Held COVID vaccination event at ODB

Increased vaccinations of ODB's guests will allow ODB to welcome more people indoors to restore indoor dining, events, and social services


The Heart of ODB

A regular volunteer who prepared food in the kitchen, served meals for guests, boxed up to-go meals, and cleaned tables in the dining room



Challenges

- COVID-19 forced ODB to close their building to indoor dining and use a pick-up window, which kept visitors from having a warm place to eat and socialize
- Limited hours of availability during the pandemic
- Fewer volunteers were able to come in and help with food prep & distribution

UCCOM Students working with ODB staff to run a COVID-19 Vaccine Drive



Impact

- Our Daily Bread (ODB) provides meals, social support, and community engagement within the underserved community of Over-The-Rhine (OTR)
- While serving over 300 meals per day, ODB works to reduce the burden of food insecurity on the homeless population of OTR
- Simultaneously, ODB works arduously to enhance the opportunities for upward mobility available to the homeless in OTR and surrounding communities

Advocacy

Key Points for Council Members



Expand affordable housing & public transportation

→ Support creation of affordable housing

Tax breaks offered to developers incentivize creation of affordable housing, but only for 15-30 years. This can incentivize a developer to transition to market-rate housing.

→ Extend impact of tax incentives

Legislation can be used to extend incentives for affordable housing beyond the 15-30 years to make a lasting impact on the housing stability—and health—of Cincinnati's residents.

→ Transportation infrastructure

Collaborate with the Better Bus Coalition to improve metro routes and expand accessibility to the greater Cincinnati area.
