


# St Joseph Home

















## **Our Project**

  - <u>Significant positive results</u> after implementing an educational brochure to standardize tracheostomy cleaning procedure amongst staff



# Why it Matters

"People with IDD who live in community-based settings continue to have poorer health than their non-disabled peers."

- American Association on Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities

We addressed **one of many contributing factors** to a diminished quality of care in the IDD population.

• Enhancing overall healthcare quality and safety within the facility extends its positive benefits on family and staff, in addition to residents.

Less infection → focus shifts to community-building and well-being.



### **Government Areas of Action**

#### Provide

Provide sustainable funding to continue providing individualized care.

#### Subsidize

Subsidize more research to effectively contain infections in IDD living communities.

#### Support

#### Advocate

Advocate for longer appointment times to foster positive and empowering communication relationships between healthcare professionals and individuals with IDD.

#### Change

Change legislature to expand the care capacity for robust IDD organizations like SJH, removing a barrier to growth.

Step 1: Appoint a designated representative from Ohio Department of Disabilities to serve as a liaison between city organizations, hospitals, educational institutions, and government boards, focused on meeting the needs of the IDD community.
