
Advocating for Affordable Housing in Cincinnati



Over-the-Rhine Community Housing

- Mission: Provide stable housing for individuals experiencing chronic housing insecurity in OTR.
- OTRCH is supported through rent payments, grants, and fundraising.


SDoH: Housing

- OTRCH addresses housing instability of OTR community members
 - purchasing, renovating, and leasing apartments at reduced rates
 advocating for the construction of new affordable units
- Hamilton County has a deficit of nearly 30,000 affordable units (2021).
- Housing is an important SDoH and often intersects with areas such as mental health, substance use, and access to social services.



LC Project Overview

- Major healthcare systems are an untapped source of support for affordable housing efforts, but opinions from healthcare professionals about affordable housing are still unknown.
- We administered a mixed-methods survey to the gauge the level of support for affordable housing efforts.
- We found that healthcare professionals strongly affirmed the importance of affordable housing on their patients' health.

Our project and Cincinnati

The relevance of this challenge to the health and wellbeing of Cincinnati citizens.

- Cincinnati has a growing problem with affordable housing, especially within the Over-the-Rhine community
- Our survey indicated that **citizens health is affected** by a struggle finding affordable housing.
- If this problem with affordable housing continues, the health of the citizens of Cincinnati will suffer.





Our Request

- We are requesting more funding and political support for local affordable housing initiatives to improve the health of our community.
- Without city council engagement, housing initiatives might face opposition from communities, hampering progress and perpetuating the crisis.
